Course A1

Objectives: Reading and listening comprehension of simple texts; giving basic personal information and to enable and establish contact with others; taking part in simple conversations; acquiring fundamental vocabulary and learning basic grammar structures that enable elementary spoken and written communication in everyday situations.

Course A2

Objectives: Communication in familiar, everyday situations; reading and listening comprehension of the basic message of texts involving topics of everyday life and familiar situations; writing elementary texts about familiar topics and personal interests.

Course B1

Objectives: Communication on general topics; means of verbal expression for more complex conversation; writing of unsophisticated official documents; comprehension of general content of simple radio or television broadcasts; command of basic vocabulary on general topics.

German Conversation Course Level A2+

Objectives: Would you like to speak better German and discuss current topics? In this course you will work with the new course book "Das Leben A2" from Cornelsen Verlag. It offers a wealth of current topics about life and work and leads learners towards speaking better German.

German Conversation Course Level B1

Familiar topics such as: family, leisure time, work and everyday life in Austria are the contents of this course. We talk about everyday situations and personal experiences. We react and give feedback to the others on the matters discussed at each meeting. We make suggestions and plan activities with a conversation partner. This course is aimed at learners who are making the leap from the use of elementary language to a more advanced level.

German Conversation Course Level B2

We discuss more complex texts based on a wider range of content from life and work. It is about reproducing texts, expressing one's own opinion, responding to specific dialogues, discussing both sides of an argument, bringing in one's own experiences as well as proposing solutions. A good level of understanding of the German language is required for this course.



LANGUAGE WORKSHOPS FOR ADULTS

Language workshop Spanish – German

This is a German-Spanish language exchange group that is free for CIC members. To participate, you should have a basic knowledge of both languages, but all levels are welcome.

Language workshop Italian - German

Greetings and How We Way Goodbye

As in every province of Austria, in Carinthia, we certainly consider ourselves very polite people. Instead of a "Guten Tag" we prefer to say "Grüß Gott", and, instead of a "auf Wiedersehen", we say "Widaschaun". Even if we enter an elevator or a waiting room at the doctor's and there are already one or more people in it, we say "hello" or "Grüß Gott" and also, we like to say goodbye with a "Pfiat di", "Servus", "Griaß eich"!

On Time and Where We Hurry

In everyday life you can be sure of one thing, buses and trains are on time and arrive as announced, just as we Austrians also prefer to be on time, normally five minutes before an appointment.

Where we all are certainly similar, is that we are always "in a rush". As an example, it is typical to see in any supermarket where several cash registers are closed, and the open one has a long queue, that if it is taking too long someone who is standing further back, calls out "second cash register please" through the store, as we do not want to wait longer, to pay and leave the shop.

From Small to Large – From Young to Old

Children under the age of 6 are not allowed to travel alone on public transport, and teenagers are nowadays (unfortunately) very busy with their smartphones due to the digital revolution.

Adults are active every day and always on the move, and our seniors over 65 will make up the largest share of the population in the future, according to forecasts.

The Privilege of Unique Nature

With our turquoise blue lakes, of drinking water quality which are surrounded by beautiful mountains and enveloped in dense forests, we are drawn magnetically to discover the delights and wonders of this privilege of outstanding natural beauty.

Whether it is spring, summer or autumn, you will always meet someone walking, running, cycling, hiking or swimming - as well as in winter skiing, ice skating, ski touring or snowshoeing.



Relaxation, Food & Tradition

As a way to relax, we enjoy nothing more than getting together whether its sitting on a park bench, meeting for a coffee or going for walks. It's nice to chat and "put the world to rights".

If we don't care about something or, if it seems less important, we prefer the vocabulary "wurscht" (doesn't matter) and we do not like to give up on our Nochspeiß (dessert) to a coffee, whether in the morning or afternoon, at work, in a coffee bar, at home or in a mountain hut.

Dairy products such as the daily glass of milk at school, cheese for breakfast (or in salads, with spreads and/or with ham (in combination = Jausn [snack])) are an indispensable part of everyday life for most people.

Numerous culinary, family and traditional festivals gather the people in the cities and countryside to celebrate them exuberantly. We love to participate actively and to preserve our traditions.

What represents the people at all these gatherings? It is the traditional costume, everyone has them. So, whether it's men in lederhosen or women in a dirndl, if you want to join in and don't already have one, get one as soon as possible. We even have our own dirndl design which is very pretty.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Carinthia is the southernmost federal state of Austria, **bordering on Italy and Slovenia**. It is in the Alpine-Adriatic region.

Encircled by mountains with many lakes and rivers, this province is known for the beauty of its natural landscape. A good infrastructure and great outdoor leisure activities offer unique opportunities to enjoy both work and free time.

The official language is German. Slovenian is also accepted as an official language, as there is a Slovenian-speaking minority in Carinthia. English is taught as the first foreign language at school.

The University of Klagenfurt (Alpen-Adria Universität) and the Carinthia University of Applied Sciences (Fachhochschule Kärnten) offer opportunities for higher education and scientific research. The private research and development sectors are well developed and have an advanced and competitive infrastructure. After tourism and the service sectors, industry is the most important driving force behind business development in Carinthia.

Carinthia has a total of more than 560,000 inhabitants. The biggest cities are the federal state capital Klagenfurt and Villach, both statutory cities with populations of around 101,300 and 62.800 respectively. Wolfsberg is the biggest town in Carinthia's sectional districts. This is followed by Spittal an der Drau, Feldkirchen, St. Veit an der Glan, Völkermarkt and Hermagor.

GEOGRAPHY AND CLIMATE

Carinthia is famous for its mountains and lakes. There are 93 mountain peaks stretching to more than 3,000 meters above sea level, including the Großglockner which at 3,798 m is Austria's highest mountain (see here).

There are roughly 1,270 lakes and they have excellent water quality. Half of Carinthia's total surface is covered with forest. There are lots of nature-related scenic attractions in Carinthia. These include the natural thermal water sources in Warmbad-Villach, Bad Kleinkirchheim, and Bad Bleiberg.



Carinthia has a surface area of 9,536 square kilometres. In the West, North and East, it borders on East Tirol, Salzburg, and Styria respectively. The border between Carinthia and Slovenia extends across 170 kilometres of mountainous terrain. The southern border between Carinthia and Italy is another 109 kilometres long. The three countries meet at the Dreiländereck, a mountain close to Arnoldstein.



Here you can see clearly each of the 9 provinces in Austria and also which borders to the other one.

CLIMATE, WEATHER AND TIME ZONE

Carinthia has a Central European temperate climate with four seasons, hot and moderately wet summers, and long harsh winters. In recent decades winters have been exceptionally arid.

The average total amount of annual sunshine hours in Austria is the highest in Carinthia.

- Carinthia is in the Central European Time zone (CET) (Mitteleuropäische Zeitzone, MEZ).
- Central European summer time (CEST/ MESZ) starts on the last Sunday of March, when clocks are put forward by an hour at 2 a.m. meaning the night is shortened by an hour.
- The change to wintertime (CET/ MEZ) takes place on the last Sunday of October when clocks are turned back an hour at 3 a.m. making the night
- an hour longer.

AUSTRIAN CULTURE

CULTURAL HISTORY

Carinthia has a rich cultural and religious heritage as many different civilisations have lived in the region since prehistoric times.

Catholicism has made profound impressions on Austrian culture and Carinthia is no exception to that. The majority of Carinthians are Roman Catholic. Further large religious groups are Protestants, people without a religious denomination and Muslims.

In Carinthia there are a lot of ossuary's and wayside shrines (Bildstöcke), romantic and gothic mural paintings (Master Thomas Artula, Villach) as well as castles and palaces. A special feature of religious art is painted Lenten Veils ("Fastentücher").

Austria has a very rich and ancient cultural tradition, especially in the fields of music and literature. One of the most important annual events that celebrates this tradition is the Carinthian Summer Music Festival in Villach. This festival was first organized in 1969, in Ossiach Abbey. Featuring world famous artists since its start, the event continues to celebrate Austria's long-standing engagement with the arts and music showcasing the best international musicians and performers (see here).

One of the most famous German literature festivals is the **Ingeborg Bachmann Prize** in Klagenfurt (https://bachmannpreis.orf.at/). Carinthia has a long list of renowned authors such as Christine Lavant, Ingeborg Bachmann, Gert Jonke, Peter Handke, Peter Turrini and Josef Winkler, to just name a few.

Local writers such as Anton Martin Slomšek and Matija Majar Ziljski have led the way in the recognition of literature in the Slovenian language in collaboration with the association Hermagoras. Celebrated writers include Milka Hartman, Florian Lipuš, Janko Mesner, Karell Smolle, Janko Ferk and Maja Haderlap.

Carinthia is also the birthplace and/or place of residence of several contemporary artists. The list includes painters Maria Lassnig, Cornelius Kolig, Valentin Oman, Hans Staudacher, Angelika Kaufmann, Giselbert Hoke as well as Anton Kolig, Franz Wiegele, Sebastian Isepp, Herbert Boeckl, Anton Mahringer, A. J. Clementschitsch, Hans Bischoffshausen and Kiki Kogelnik among others.

Finally, a lot of information about museums, galleries, architecture, sculpting, painting and other cultural events can be found here.



NATIONAL INSURANCE IN AUSTRIA

Basic insurance is provided for everybody by the Austrian national insurance system called "Sozialversicherung." It covers the areas of health insurance, accident insurance, unemployment insurance and retirement pension insurance. It is financed mainly by contributions from the employee and the employer.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Austria has a compulsory insurance system. Every employed person must have health insurance. You are not able to choose your health insurance yourself as it is dependent on the employer and their field. People employed in private industries are insured by the regional medical insurance company ("Österreichische Gesundheitskasse") of their federal state. However, you can have private insurance as well.

Health insurance covers illness, maternity leave and inability to work as a result of illness.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Accident insurance covers accidents at work and illness while employed. It can generate non-cash benefits and cash payments, generally in the form of accident benefits.

Private supplementary insurance payments can be made in addition to compulsory insurance, for example for dental costs, supplementary pension contributions, or spa/health resort cures and alternative treatments.

NATIONAL INSURANCE CONTRIBUTIONS

The foundation for the calculation of contributions is the earned income of the insured person. This earned income is used to calculate the insurance contributions. If the income is higher than the maximum basic contribution this is considered in the calculation. The insurance contributions are for retirement pension insurance, health insurance, unemployment insurance, for a labour chamber (AK) contribution and housing subsidy contribution. In addition to this, the company pays for a company pension plan contribution, accident insurance and IESG (Insolvenz-Entgeltsicherungsgesetz) supplement.

OPENING TIMES

Most grocery shops are open between 7:15 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. from Monday to Friday, and from 7:15 a.m. till 6:00 p.m. on Saturdays. **Almost all shops are closed on Sundays.** Exceptions are shops in tourist areas that open from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the summer and winter seasons. Petrol stations often offer a basic selection of food and drinks and are open on Sundays and public holidays.

In town centres many shops open from 9:00 a.m. and close between 6:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m., (although some stay open later). Shopping malls like <u>ATRIO</u> in Villach or <u>City Arkaden</u> in Klagenfurt are open from 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. during the week and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Public Authorities and Administrative Offices (e.g. tax office)

Mon/Tue/Wed/Thu from 7:30 a.m. till 3:30 p.m.

Fri from 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Post offices

Most post offices are open from Mon-Fri 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. and 2 p.m. or 3 p.m. until 5 p.m. or 6 p.m. Some **do not** open in the afternoon, and others also open on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Post offices can also be found in shops such as Spar, newsagents or petrol stations. Please find an overview here. You can also search at Tools/Filialfinder. Opening times of branches vary and are always shown at the entrance to the branch. Some branches in towns open on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays, although at reduced hours. These are usually found close to train stations.

Banks and Exchange offices

Mon-Wed, Fri 8/9 a.m. – 3 p.m., Thu 8/9 a.m. till 5:30 p.m. Branches are usually closed between 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m.

MARKETS

Klagenfurt Markets

Benediktinermarkt

The most important marketplace in Klagenfurt is the Benediktinerplatz. Farmers from Carinthia, Friaul (Italy) and Slovenia sell locally produced delicacies on the traditional market days.

Thursdays and Saturdays (6 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.).

Weekly Markets

Waidmannsdorf (Crossing Kanaltalerstraße-Baumbachplatz) and Viktring, Viktringerplatz.

Wednesdays and Saturdays (6 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.).

Bio Market

Every Friday produce from purely organic suppliers is sold on the Benediktinerplatz (6 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.).

Both market halls are also open daily from 6:30 a.m. till 6 p.m. In addition to the usual selection, many gardeners sell plants here from 6:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Villach Markets

Weekly Market

Wednesdays and Saturdays (Draulände/ Markthalle) from 7 a.m. till 12:00 p.m. As well as fruit and vegetables, local producers sell cold cuts of meat, pasta delicacies, honey, fish and seafood.

Bio-Bauernmarkt

On Fridays organic products from local farmers are sold in <u>Hans-Gasser-Platz</u> (9 a.m. to 3 p.m.). The produce includes fruit and vegetables, as well as cold cuts of meat, cheese and pastry.

FLAT/HOUSE HUNTING

Information about available flats or houses is published in daily newspapers (e.g. Kleine Zeitung — weekend editions are of particular interest or can be obtained via specialized agents or agencies (ImmobilienmaklerInnen — you find them in local yellow pages under "Immobilien") and a diverse set of other websites. For instance, city and community administrations also offer information about property available.



Rental costs depend on several factors, such as distances to transport networks, infrastructure, the residential area as well as the flat/house itself (furnished or unfurnished, etc.). In addition, general running costs (around 25% of the net rent) for water, electricity, gas and/or other heating costs etc. need to be taken into consideration.

Before formally signing an agreement to rent or buy a property, you may wish to consult guidance and support infrastructures, to verify the legitimacy of the contract.

Therefore, the 130,000 cats and 40,000 dogs belonging to the Carinthians, lack for nothing. Together with a strict animal protection law, you will also find animal rescue homes, grooming parlours, diverse specialised trade stores for animal food and accessories as well as The Cat Café in Klagenfurt (which, for all cat lovers is a must!)

LOSS OF DOCUMENTS

In case of loss or theft of personal identification or other documents (passport, driving license, documents for vehicles etc.) please go to your nearest police station. You will need an official declaration of loss or theft for the issuing of duplicates (via embassies or consulates), as well as for insurance claims.

Important personal documents (e.g. birth certificate, marriage certificate, possibly certificate of adoption) should be brought with you to Austria. In some circumstances, a translation of the documents may be required.

<u>Here</u> you can find a list of all translators available in Carinthia. If you need help finding the right one for your language, we are at your disposal.

WASTE SEPARATION

In Austria paper, plastic, tins and cans (yellow bag), and organic waste are collected and disposed of in separate containers. There are also specific facilities or collection points for glass. Toxic waste is dealt with at special waste collection points. Old batteries can be returned to shops that sell batteries. You can find an overview about recycling collection points, how to separate waste and collection dates here.



HEALTH

Everybody who lives and works in Austria must pay health insurance as it is part of the country's social security system. It covers basic medical services and visits to the dentist, as well as hospitalisation and medicine. It is also possible to include non-working relatives and children in your health insurance.

Prescription-free drugs can be obtained at the pharmacy (Apotheke). The same pharmacies also sell prescription drugs. There are no over-the-counter sales for drugs in supermarkets. Prescriptions can only be issued by doctors, following a visit. Local newspapers publish information about pharmacies that are open on weekends/nights and you can find them here as well: Villach - Klagenfurt.

DOCTORS AND DENTISTS

The doctors and dentists you can consult depends on your health insurance. If you are insured with the public health authority Österreichische Gesundheitskasse (ÖGK) you can consult doctors registered with the ÖGK for free. You must bring your e-card to every visit.

It is also possible to get private medical care. In this case you need to pay the doctor (known as a "Wahlarzt/-ärztin") or dentist ("Wahlzahnarzt/-ärztin") directly. Depending on your insurance, you may be able to claim some of the cost of your consultation afterwards.

Emergency doctor service:

On weekends and public holidays and during the night, you can contact the medical service (141). In emergency cases you may also get medical attention in hospitals.

Foreign language doctors can be found here. On the screen you will find a link to search for doctors (Arztsuche). The search option allows you to specify and choose between different specialists such as Internal Medicine (Internist), General Practitioners (Allgemein-Mediziner), location and language. The result should be the doctor of your choice closest to your home.

FSME - Meningoencephalitis

Large areas of Austria are at risk of Early Summer Meningoencephalitis (FSME) at certain times of the year. FSME is a virus that can be transferred through tick-bites. Austria officially recommends active immunisation through vaccination. Before vaccination a doctor should be consulted.

MOBILE NETWORK PROVIDERS

The mobile phone operators (A1 Telekom, Hutchison Drei Austria und Magenta Telekom – Status: August 2021) have different conditions regarding the signing of a mobile phone contract for non-Austrians. You can find more information about mobile phone providers on their webpage. Some also offer a prepaid card without registration (A1 and Magenta).

Austrians look back on their roots with care and a certain pride and lovingly uphold their traditions. From childhood onwards, people in this country grow up with regional customs and rites and integrate them into their way of life.

Traditions related to customs and cultural heritage are encountered in annual celebrations, life events (births, baptisms, weddings or funerals) and partly through daily living (church services, greetings and clothing). Also at various village festivals, that are celebrated on church holidays one encounters such customary acts.

"Mayday" National Holiday (Labour Day is celebrated 1st May each year)

While St. Nicholas rewards children who have been good during the year with gifts, Krampus rattles chains and scares children who have been bad. Find here more about this custom.



- Breakfast between 6.30 a.m. and 10 a.m.
- Lunch between 11.30 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- Dinner between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

TRANSPORT AND TRAFFIC

AIRPORTS

Carinthia's International Airport is located in Klagenfurt-Annabichl.

Other airports include Graz, Salzburg, Ljubljana in Slovenia and Marco Polo – Venice, Treviso and Trieste in Italy. These are all reachable by car in between one to three hours.

There is also Wien-Schwechat in Vienna and smaller ones just outside Innsbruck and Linz.

BUS SERVICE

Bus service information, in Carinthia, can be found <u>here</u>.

RAILWAY NETWORK

The central train station in Villach is the transport hub for the Southern Line from Vienna to Italy (via Arnoldstein), the North-Eastern Tauernbahn that connects



Salzburg to the East and South of Tyrol (via Spittal an der Drau) and the Karawankenbahn Line to Slovenia (via Finkenstein and Rosenbach).

You can download an app for your mobile device <u>ÖBB Scotty</u>, with all the routes and times. With this app you can also buy an online ticket: <u>ÖBB</u>.

ROAD TRAFFIC

Motorways cover similar routes. The A2 runs from Vienna via Graz through Villach to Italy. The A10 (Tauernautobahn) connects Salzburg to Villach via the Katschbergtunnel (5,439m long) and the A11 extends to Slovenia through the Karawanken tunnel (which is 7,864m long). The connection between Klagenfurt and Slovenia crosses the Loiblpass (1,367m in altitude). In winter, it is compulsory to have **winter tyres**.

Important mountain passes in Carinthia are the **Großglockner Hochalpenstraße** and the **Nockalmstraße**.

DRIVING LICENSES

Valid non-EU or non-EEA driving licenses must be converted within six months of establishing your place of residence in Austria. This has to be done at the driving license authorities (in cities this is the Federal Police Directorate, in municipalities the district authority).

PETROL STATIONS

Not all petrol stations are open 24 hours a day.

ROAD TAX FOR MOTORWAYS: Autobahnvignette

To drive on motorways, you must buy an Autobahnvignette (a sticker to attach to the windshield or a digital version). You can get the sticker or a digital vignette at petrol stations, in tobacconists and at automobile associations (such as the ÖAMTC): <u>Sale points</u>.

WHAT THE TRAFFIC LIGHTS MEAN.

- A red light means that drivers must stop.
- An illuminated yellow light together with the red light also means you
 must stop and lets the road-user know that the signal for "Go" will follow.



- A green light means you can go.
- The green light flashes four times before it changes to yellow. This
 means the signal will change.
- A yellow constant light means you must stop. Drivers who find themselves already on a junction on a constant yellow light should leave it as soon as possible.
- A flashing yellow light means you may proceed if there is no oncoming traffic, but you must take great care.

Driving in Slovenia & Italy - Good to Know

Even though these two countries border Carinthia and Austria and we are all members of the European Union, there are slightly different traffic regulations or rules than in our country, which in detail, please see for Slovenia here and for Italy here.

PARKING

In and around city centres there are different types of parking zones. In short stay zones charges apply and in free parking zones further out they don't. Parking zones where charges apply are marked by blue lines on the road. In Klagenfurt there is a zone marked by green lines on the road for cheap all-day parking.

In free parking zones you need to display a parking clock on your car dashboard inside your windscreen. <u>This is not optional</u>: you will get a parking ticket if you don't! You can buy one in a car accessory shop.

Parking in Villach

In marked parking zones within 4 minutes' walk of the 'Hauptplatz' there is a fee of 60 cents per half hour which must be paid at a ticket machine or via your mobile phone. The maximum stay is 3 hours. For stays of up to 20 minutes there is no parking fee, but your arrival time must be displayed in your car.

In short stay zones payment is required at the following times.

Mondays to Thursdays from 8 a.m. - 6 p.m.

Fridays from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.

No payment is required on Friday afternoons or Saturday mornings, but the maximum period is 3 hours and you must use your parking clock (otherwise you will get a parking ticket!)



In other free parking zones, the maximum long stay period with a parking clock is either an hour and a half or three hours. Parking is permitted on Mondays to Fridays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. -1 p.m. or 10 a.m. -1 p.m.

To find out about paying parking fees via your mobile phone see here.

You can park at Willroider Parkplatz for free, which is 10 minutes from the city centre on foot.

Parking in Klagenfurt

The short stay parking zone is marked by blue lines on the road. The maximum parking time is 3 hours. In this zone you can park your vehicle for 15 minutes free of charge as long as the exact arrival time is shown either on a handwritten note or on a parking clock. If you stay longer than 30 minutes you need to pay from that first minute on.

Parking tickets are available from machines in the zone. The fee is 90 cents per half hour and applies during these periods.

Mondays to Fridays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays from 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

It is also possible to pay parking fees via your mobile phone (see here).

BIKES

The bike path network is extensive. There are cycle paths along the Drau/Gail, around lakes, to Tarvisio in Italy and beyond. To cycle alone on public roads children must be 12 or 10 if they have passed a proficiency test. Cycling on public footpaths is only allowed if it leads to a bike park or, if a child on a bike, is accompanied by an adult. The alcohol limit for cyclists is slightly higher than for motorists at 0.8 mg per 1000 ml.

MOTOR INSURANCE

If you own a vehicle and drive it on the road you must purchase liability insurance with a motor insurance company. The motor insurance company you choose issues you with a registration certificate and number plates.

HIGH VISIBILITY JACKETS (ROAD OR MOTORWAY REQUIREMENTS)

Drivers of road vehicles (with the exceptions of motorbikes and bikes) must carry a high visibility reflective jacket ("Warnweste") in their vehicle at all times. One is required for each passenger. Vehicles also need to carry a first aid kit and a breakdown triangle.

Following an accident or breakdown, you must put on such a jacket if you get out of your vehicle on a motorway, main road or country road (outside city limits) and you must put up a breakdown triangle. High visibility jackets should also be worn on roads with poor visibility, or in bad weather, at dawn or dusk and at night.



HEADLIGHTS (ROAD OR MOTORWAY REQUIREMENTS)

You can switch on your vehicle's lights during the day, but it is not compulsory. You are required to switch your headlights on when travelling through a tunnel.

MOBILE PHONES WHILE DRIVING

It is against the law to use your mobile phone whilst driving unless you use it with a hands-free car kit. Exactly the same principle applies to cyclists, who risk a penalty. The list of penalties you can find <u>here</u>.

If a road sign states "Rechtsvorrang", this means that the driver coming from the right has priority.

Obtain a national insurance number and e-card. For employees: your social insurance number will be given to you by your employer. To order an e-card you need a confirmation of the application for the Certificate of Registration. You can order an e-card here.</th></tr><tr><th>Bank account</th><th>To open a bank account these documents are necessary: current photo ID, passport or identity card and driving licence.</th></tr><tr><th>Vehicle registration</th><th>Register your foreign vehicle within one month of entering the country! If you import a vehicle, you will have to pay NoVA tax at the Tax Office/Finanzamt. If you do not re-register your vehicle, you will be punished with heavy fines. Registration papers are necessary. Driving licence	If necessary, change your driving licence for an Austrian one (not necessary for EU citizens).
Tax office	Register at the appropriate tax office (for taxes and family allowance)

Immigration/ VISA	Submit your registration certificate to the administrative authority (Bezirkshauptmannschaft, Magistrat) if you intend to stay longer than 3 months.
